Re: Proposal to Amend Resolution R-16-065

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Since the original submission of R-16-065, the State of New Hampshire, Department of Health and Human Services has proposed a revision to their original award, to increase funding and extend the time period of the grant. The amendment revises the amount of the award from \$33,021.38, to an amount not to exceed \$264,168.96. In addition, the grant period would be extended from the original proposed expiration date of December 31, 2016, to September 30, 2018.

Please find the proposed amended version of resolution R-16-065.

As a result of the States proposed revisions, we would like to ask the Board of Aldermen to accept and appropriate up to \$264,168.96 for the purpose of providing fixed route transportation services for individuals ages 60 and up. This funding shall be in effect upon approval by the State of New Hampshire Governor and Executive Council through September 30, 2018.

“FEDERAL TRANSIT AUTHORITY (“FTA”) OPERATING GRANT”**

### *CITY OF NASHUA*

*In the Year Two Thousand and Sixteen*

**RESOLVED** by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Nashua that the City of Nashua and the Division of Community Development are authorized to accept and appropriate up to \$264,168.96 from the State of New Hampshire, Department of Health and Human Services into Transit Grant Activity “Federal Transit Authority (“FTA”) Operating Grant” for the purpose of providing fixed route transportation services for individuals ages 60 and up. This funding shall be in effect from October 1, 2016 through September 30, 2018.
