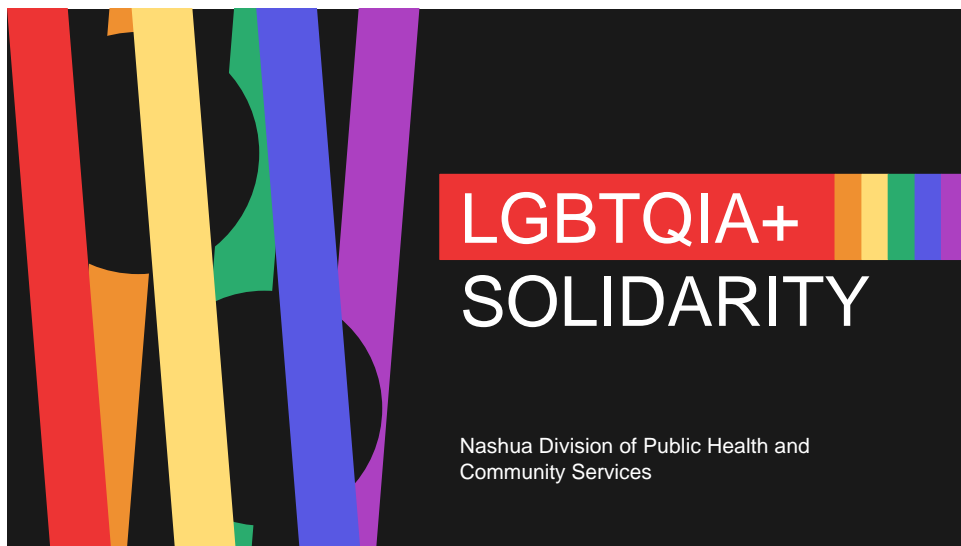

- NH Rapid Response Access Point
 - Eric Eason – Beacon Health Systems – Power Point Provided
 - 75% of call coming into the Rapids Response system only require talking to a rapid response call center professional.
 - Opportunity to respond via local mobile crisis private lines
 - Follow up is part of the services offered
 - 30% of interactions access calls result in mobile deployments
 - 833# will remain in effect after 7/16/2022
 - No dedicated bilingual staff at this time/ Language-line is used at the moment
 - 833# will go live with suicide prevention hotline calls
 - 20 staff members currently work the NH Rapid Response call center, looking to double the number by July.
 - Nashua Rapid Response has 22 staff members spread throughout 24 hours in three shifts.
 - Telehealth is being offered by some teams if no one is available locally to deploy.
