



## ORDINANCE

### INCREASING ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH DEPARTMENT FEES

### *CITY OF NASHUA*

*In the Year Two Thousand and Six*

*The City of Nashua ordains* that the Nashua Revised Ordinances, as amended, are hereby further amended as follows:

1. In Chapter 9 “Food and Food Service Establishments”, Article II “Establishment Health Regulations”, Section 9-19 “License – Fee schedule”, delete the section in its entirety and replace it with the following new language:

**“Sec. 9-19. Same—Fee schedule.**

Each application for, or renewal of, a license to operate a food service establishment within the meaning of this article shall be accompanied by a fee appropriate to the type and size of the operation in accordance with the following schedule:

Bakeries	\$ 175.00
Caterers	\$ 175.00
Commissaries	\$ 175.00
Hospitals	\$ 175.00
Nursing homes	\$ 175.00
Private schools	\$ 175.00
Beverage manufacturing and bottling	\$ 140.00
Mobile vendors	\$ 140.00
Shellfish vendors	\$ 140.00
Churches	\$ 35.00
Temporary licenses	\$ 35.00
Food manufacturing and packaging	\$ 280.00
Social clubs	\$ 45.00

Vending locations \$ 15.00

Retail stores:

Prepackaged items only \$ 90.00  
With perishable foods add \$ 90.00  
With delicatessen add \$ 90.00  
With bulk foods/salad bar add \$ 90.00

Restaurants \$ 75.00

Plus \$1.50 per seat (based on  
fire department permit)  
Plus \$1.50 per seat for open air  
café seating

Restaurants with common seating (mall) \$ 200.00

The environmental health department shall make the final determination as to which license fee is applicable to each individual food service operation or establishment.”

2. In Chapter 10 “Garbage, Trash and Refuse”, Article III “Commercial Solid Waste Storage, Collection and Handling”, Section 10-42 “Permit application procedure”, subsection (2), change the amount of “two hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$225.00)” to “three hundred dollars (\$300.00)”.

3. In Chapter 16 “Planning”, Article X “Definitions and Submittal Requirements”, Division II “Submittal Requirements”, Section 16-1100 “Submittal Requirements”, Subsection B-2 “Fees”, paragraph (b) “Permit and application fees”, number (15) “Subdivision plan review of individual sewage disposal systems, per review”, change the amount of “\$20.00” to “\$40.00”.

4. In Chapter 18 “Sewage Disposal”, Article III “Individual Sewage Disposal Systems”, Section 18-139 “Sewerage disposal system construction permit and specifications”, subsection (f) delete the subsection in its entirety and replace it with the following new language:

“(f) Charges for a sewage disposal construction permit shall be as follows:

(1) Test Pit, each (includes subdivision test pits) \$40.00  
(2) Plan Reviews \$35.00  
(3) Final Inspections \$25.00”

5. In Chapter 20 “Swimming Pools, Spas and Hot Tubs”, Section 20-2 “License – Required; fees; expiration; posting” delete the section in its entirety and replace it with the following new language:

**“Sec. 20-2. License – Required; fees; expiration; posting.**

No person, corporation or other entity shall operate, maintain or allow to be used any public swimming pool, spa or hot tub except in possession of a valid license issued by the

city environmental health department. Said licenses shall be issued for an annual fee of three hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$325.00) for each indoor pool or two hundred and seventy-five dollars (\$275.00) for each outdoor pool. Spa and hot tub permits will be issued at two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) per tub or spa. Licenses will be issued annually and expire April thirtieth. This license shall be posted in a conspicuous place about the pool or spa.”

This legislation shall take effect upon passage.
