



ORDINANCE

DELETE PROVISIONS FOR ALDERMANIC APPROVAL OF SCHOOL DEPARTMENT SALARIES

CITY OF NASHUA

In the Year Two Thousand and Seven

The City of Nashua ordains that Chapter 2 “Administration”, Article VIII “Board of Education”, of the Nashua Revised Ordinances, as amended, is hereby further amended as follows:

1. In Sec. 2-701 “Compensation of members”, delete the struck-through language and add the new underlined language as follows:

“Sec. 2-701. Compensation of members.

Pursuant to Section 76 of the Nashua City Charter, Each member of the board of education shall receive as compensation the sum of three thousand six hundred eighty dollars (\$3,680.00) per year, payable quarterly.”

2. Delete Sec. 2-702 in its entirety, as follows:

~~“Sec. 2-702. Aldermanic approval of school department salaries.~~

~~For the purpose of implementing the requirements of charter section 56-g, the following provisions shall apply:~~

~~(a) — Wages and salaries for positions covered by collective bargaining agreements shall be deemed approved upon the general approval by the board of aldermen of the cost items contained in any such collective bargaining agreement.~~

~~(b) — Wages and salaries of position funded by grants, reimbursements, and similar special projects outside the city budget are approved without further action by the board of aldermen upon approval by the funding source of the grant or special project.~~

~~(c) — Wages and salaries for part time, seasonal and intermittent positions, such as tutors, substitutes, adult education and summer school will be noted in the school department budget submission and be deemed approved upon the passage of the annual budget.~~

~~(d) — Wages and salaries for all remaining positions shall be within ranges approved by the board of aldermen, from time to time, upon request of the board of education or school administration.~~

Secs. ~~2-703~~ 2-702—2-715. Reserved”

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

This ordinance shall take effect following its passage.
