



ORDINANCE

ASSIGNING RESPONSIBILITY FOR ROADS TO THE INFRASTRUCTURE COMMITTEE AND CREATING A BROAD STREET PARKWAY LIAISON ONE-MEMBER COMMITTEE

CITY OF NASHUA

In the Year Two Thousand and Eight

The City of Nashua ordains that Chapter 5 entitled "Administration of Government", Part 2, "Board of Aldermen," Article II, "General Provisions," Section 5-9 "Standing Committees," of the Nashua Revised Ordinances, as amended, is hereby amended by adding the new language in italics as follows:

§ 5-9. Standing committees.

...

- B. The President shall appoint Aldermen as called for, with the first named being Chairman and the second named being Vice Chairman, to the following standing committees:

...

- (2) Five-member committees

...

- (b) Infrastructure: responsible for traffic, streetlights, street acceptance, sewer hookup approvals, *roads* and lands and buildings.

...

- (4) One-member committees. One-member committees shall have an alternate member appointed in the same fashion as the regular member.

...

- (j) *Broad Street Parkway Liaison Committee, who shall be a member of the Infrastructure Committee, elected by its members and confirmed by the full board. This committee shall exist until the Broad Street Parkway projected is completed.*

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

This ordinance shall take effect following its passage.

ANALYSIS

This ordinance creates the Broad Street Parkway Liaison as a one-member standing committee. This liaison committee is chosen by election among the members of the Infrastructure Committee. That choice is then ratified by the full board. Concurrently, the ordinance assigns responsibility for "roads" to the Infrastructure Committee, in order to confirm that aldermanic oversight of the parkway project will occur through that committee.

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




