



ORDINANCE

RELATIVE TO DISCLOSURE OF PARTICIPATION IN AND REASONING FOR RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN

CITY OF NASHUA

In the Year Two Thousand and Ten

The City of Nashua ordains that Part I “Administrative Legislation”, Chapter 5 “Administration of Government”, Part 2 “Board of Aldermen”, Article III “Rules and Order of Business”, Section 5-24 “Other applicable rules” of the Nashua Revised Ordinances, as amended, hereby be further amended by adding the following new subsection:

“§ 5-24. Other applicable rules.

...

- D. Any recommendation made to the Board of Aldermen by city staff as part of their employment shall include the names and job titles of the city staff that participated in producing the recommendation and the reasons for the recommendation.”

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

This ordinance shall take effect following its passage.
