Bill Text: **PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CITY CHARTER RELATIVE TO REVISING THE LENGTH OF THE ELECTED TERM OF THE MAYOR**

In the Year Two Thousand and Two RESOLVED by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Nashua that pursuant to RSA 49-B:5, the following amendment to the Nashua City Charter is deemed necessary and shall be submitted to the voters by placing it on the ballot at the next regular state biennial election in the manner required by NH RSA 49-B with the following summary: Shall the municipality approve the Charter amendment summarized below? This charter amendment would reduce the length of the mayor's term of office from four (4) years to two (2) years. Amend Section 40 I of the City Charter by deleting the struck-through language, adding new language in italics as follows: "I. The mayor shall be elected for a term of four two years at every other municipal election beginning in the year 1971 commencing with the 2003 municipal election."
