**RESOLVED** by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Nashua that the City of Nashua and the Nashua Police Department are authorized to accept and appropriate \$26,032.02 from the State of New Hampshire Department of Safety into Police Grant Activity “FY2018 Sustained Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP)” for the purpose of funding overtime and related benefits for traffic enforcement activities. Matching funds in the amount of \$6,508.01 are required for this grant and will be provided as an “in-kind” match through the value of existing personnel efforts within the police department operating budget.
