RECOGNIZING LOLA GIANNELLI AS NEW HAMPSHIRE'S FIRST KID GOVERNOR

CITY OF NASHUA

In the Year Two Thousand and Nineteen

WHEREAS, Lola Giannelli is New Hampshire's first Kid Governor. The fifth graders of New Hampshire elected Lola, who attends Sunset Heights Elementary School, to serve as the 2019 New Hampshire's Kid Governor. She is working with her Executive Council to bring awareness of animal cruelty to the State of New Hampshire.

WHEREAS, Lola is starting a club at Sunset Heights to make dog toys for the Humane Society. She is also providing Beaver Meadow School in Concord and Canterbury Elementary School with donated supplies so that her Executive Council members, Evelyn Ellis-Haines and Ben Vachon, can start clubs in their schools.

WHEREAS, Lola will be working with Nashua's state legislators to propose a law to prohibit the sale of dogs, cats and rabbits at pet stores. This recently became a law in California. She and her Executive Council will be collecting signatures.

WHEREAS, Lola volunteers at the End 68 Hours of Hunger to bring awareness to her Executive Council member Evelyn Ellis-Haines's platform of poverty.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Nashua that the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen recognize Lola Giannelli for her accomplishment of being elected 2019 Kid Governor and for her volunteer efforts.
