# What is Hepatitis A?

Hepatitis A is a virus that can cause liver infection. The virus spreads easily from person to person.

# How is the Virus spread?

When a person ingests the virus from objects, food, or drinks contaminated by small amounts of stool from an infected person.

Contaminated food and drink



Not washing hands after bathroom use



Drug use

# Prevent the Spread

- Wash your hands frequently - especially after bathroom use or before food preparation.
- Avoid sex with someone who has Hepatitis A infection.
- Do not share personal items.
- Do not share food or drinks.
- Do not share smoking devices, syringes, or drug use equipment
- Do not use toilet water for injection drug use.

The best way to protect yourself from this vaccine preventable illness is to get vaccinated with the Hepatitis A vaccine.

# Who is at risk?


Anyone can get Hepatitis A, but the persons at higher risk are:

- Men who have sex with men
- People with Substance Use Disorder
- People experiencing transient housing or homelessness
- People with recent jail stay


# Who Should get Vaccinated?

Populations who should get vaccinated include, but are not limited to:

- Recreational drug users
- Travelers who may have been to a country where Hepatitis A is common
- Men who have sex with men
- A person who has contact with someone who has Hepatitis A
- Someone who has a clotting disorder
