CHILDHOOD BLOOD LEAD TESTING: IT'S THE LAW



ALL CHILDREN ARE AT RISK FOR LEAD POISONING







Wash work clothes (mechanic, construction, fisherman, etc.) alone.



Wet-mop floors, window frames and sills, and other surfaces weekly. Use a damp cloth when you dust.



Keep children away from chipping and peeling paint.



Wash children's hands before eating, sleeping, and after playing.



Use cold water for drinking and making baby formula. Run 1 minute before using water.



Wash pacifiers, toys, and play spaces often.

DID YOU KNOW?

Lead exposure may harm the brain, damage speech and hearing, and create learning and behavior problems.

Children can become poisoned by swallowing or breathing in lead dust.

Most lead poisoning is caused by dust from paint in homes and buildings built before the 1978 ban on lead paint.

Over 50% of Greater Nashua homes were built before the lead paint ban.
