



There were A LOT of GREAT ideas gathered through this effort, but we just couldn't implement them all.

- Some project ideas exceeded the \$40,000 budget.
- Some were already being addressed through other programs.
- Some just were not eligible (i.e., were not capital projects).

Here are the project ideas that were submitted that Your Voice, Your Choice can't fund:

BASKETBALL COURT

- The City does not have suitable land available to build a new basketball court within the neighborhood and purchasing land would exceed the project budget.
- Basketball Courts within a mile (walking) of the Tree Streets:
 - Memorial Park on Ledge Street
 - Sullivan Park on Bowers Street

SPLASH PAD AT PARK SOCIAL

- State law requires that full bathroom facilities exist within 200 feet of a splash pad and building those bathrooms would exceed the project budget.
- Cooling misters at Park Social that were turned off and winterized several years ago will be turned back on in 2022.

SPEED BUMPS

- Speed bumps are typically found on private roadways and parking lots and are not recommended for public roadways.
- There is a project proposal to install a crosswalk and flashing beacon on Ash Street by the parks.

ASSISTANCE FOR THE HOMELESS

- Constructing a new homeless shelter or hostel would exceed the project budget.
- Operating a homeless shelter would require annual funding (not a capital project).
- A homelessness prevention program would also require annual funding (not a capital project).

 - Spanish-speaking low cost day care: this would require annual funding and would be considered a program, not a capital project.
 - Multi-language resource directory: City Hall is exploring a solution through another project.

SUBSTANCE ABUSE ASSISTANCE

- This would require annual funding and would be considered a program, not a capital project.

WAGE ASSISTANCE

- This would require annual funding and would be considered a program, not a capital project.

RECREATION/COMMUNITY CENTER

- Constructing a recreation/community center for kids and/or adults would exceed the project budget and operating the center would require annual funding (not a capital project).

NEW PARK AND/OR PLAYGROUND

- The City does not have suitable land available to build a new park and/or playground within the neighborhood and purchasing land would exceed the project budget.
- There is a project proposal to update and improve Los Amigos Park on Ash Street.

PEDESTRIAN LIGHTING

- Additional lighting on Kinsley Street and West Hollis Street would exceed the \$40,000 project budget.

COMMUNITY EVENTS

- Ideas submitted include a culture parade and a downtown movie night, however these are not considered capital projects.

DOWNTOWN BARRIERS

- Both removing and keeping the outdoor dining barriers were suggested, however these are not considered capital projects.

NEIGHBORHOOD CLEAN-UP

- This is not considered a capital project.

MORE FUNDING AND STAFF FOR PAL

- This is not considered a capital project.

MORE/FREE PARKING

- The City does not have suitable land available to build a new parking garage/lot within the neighborhood and purchasing land would exceed the project budget.

SECURITY CAMERAS ON TRAILS

- This project could install cameras but could not fund their operations as it would require annual funding (not a capital project).

FOOD TRUCK/MOBILE MARKET

- Purchasing a food truck would exceed the project budget. It would also require a program to manage the operations.

FOOTBALL FIELD

- The City does not have suitable land available to build a football field within the neighborhood and purchasing land would exceed the project budget.

PICKLEBALL COURTS

- The City does not have suitable land available to build pickleball courts within the neighborhood and purchasing land would exceed the project budget.
