Built in 1903 with memorial funds donated to the City of Nashua by the family of John M. Hunt, a former Nashua Postmaster. Noted New Hampshire native architect Ralph Adams Cram designed the Elizabethan-Gothic style building. For significance of architecture and urban planning, it was entered in the National Register of Historic Places in 1971. Appropriately named the Hunt Memorial Library, it served as the city's public library for 68 years. To accommodate the needs of our growing community, a new public library was built. Since 1991 a volunteer Board of Trustees has endeavored to restore and preserve the Hunt.
